The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act to eliminate racial and ethnic health disparities in the commonwealth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The second paragraph of section 16 of chapter 6A of the General Laws, as
2 appearing in section 13 of chapter 165 of the acts of 2014, is hereby amended by striking out the
3 words “and, (7) the health facilities appeals board ” and inserting in place thereof the following
4 words:- (7) the health facilities appeal board; and (8) the office of health equity.

5 SECTION 2. Section 16O of said chapter 6A, as appearing in section 16 of chapter 38 of
6 the acts of 2013, is hereby amended by inserting after the word, “recommendations,” in line 3,
7 the following words:- to the director of the office of health equity.

8 SECTION 3. Said section 16O of said chapter 6A, as so appearing, is hereby further
9 amended by inserting after the words “the commissioner of public health or a designee, who

10 shall serve ex officio”, the following words:- ; the director of the office of health equity, or the
11 director’s designee.

12 SECTION 4. Said chapter 6A is hereby amended by inserting after section 16V, as
13 inserted by section 17 of chapter 38 of the acts of 2013, the following section: –

14 Section 16W. (a) As used in this section the following words shall, unless the context
15 clearly requires otherwise, have the following meanings: –

16 “Disparities”, differences in the incidence, prevalence, mortality and burden of diseases
17 and other adverse health conditions that exist among specific racial and ethnic groups.

18 “Office”, the office of health equity.

19 (b) There shall be an office of health equity within the executive office of health and
20 human services. The office shall be in the charge of a director, who shall report directly to the
21 secretary of health and human services. The health disparities council, established in section
22 16O, shall serve as an advisory board to the office of health equity.

23 (c) The office, subject to appropriation, shall coordinate all activities of the
24 commonwealth to eliminate racial and ethnic health and health care disparities. The office shall
25 set goals for the reduction of disparities and prepare an annual plan for the commonwealth to
26 eliminate disparities.

27 (d) The office, subject to appropriation, shall collaborate with other state agencies of the
28 commonwealth on disparities reduction initiatives to address the social factors that influence
29 health inequality. The state agencies shall include, but shall not be limited to, the executive office
30 of health and human services, the executive office of housing and economic development, the

31 executive office of public safety and security, the executive office of energy and environmental
32 affairs, the Massachusetts Department of Transportation, the executive office of labor and
33 workforce development and the executive office of education. The office shall facilitate
34 communication and partnership between these agencies to develop greater understanding of the
35 intersections between agency activities and health outcomes. The office shall facilitate
36 development of interagency initiatives to address the social and economic determinants of health
37 and key health disparities issues including, but not limited to, healthcare access and quality;
38 housing availability and quality; transportation availability, location and cost; community
39 policing and safe spaces; air, water, land usage and quality; employment and workforce
40 development; and education access and quality.

41 (e) The office, subject to appropriation, shall evaluate the effectiveness of programs and
42 interventions to eliminate health disparities, identifying best practices and model programs for
43 the state.

44 (f) The secretary of health and human services shall annually, on the day assigned for
45 submission of the budget by the governor to the general court pursuant to section 7H of chapter
46 29, designate major initiatives of the commonwealth affecting the health and health care of
47 residents of the commonwealth. The initiatives may include any activity of the commonwealth
48 including, but not limited to, activities of the executive office of health and human services, the
49 executive office of housing and economic development, the executive office of public safety and
50 security, the executive office of energy and environmental affairs, the Massachusetts Department
51 of Transportation, the executive office of labor and workforce development and the executive
52 office of education.

53 For each major initiative, the office shall prepare a disparities impact statement
54 evaluating the likely positive or negative impact of each initiative on eliminating or reducing
55 racial and ethnic health disparities. The statements shall, to the extent possible, include
56 quantifiable impacts and evaluation benchmarks. The statements shall be posted on the official
57 internet site of the executive office of health and human services and submitted to the clerks of
58 the house of representatives and senate, members of the health disparities council, and the house
59 and senate committees on ways and means.

60 (g) The office, subject to appropriation, shall prepare an annual health disparities report
61 card. The report card shall evaluate the progress of the commonwealth toward eliminating racial
62 and ethnic health disparities, using, where possible, quantifiable measures and comparative
63 benchmarks. The report card shall report on progress on a regional basis, based on regions
64 designated by the office. The office shall hold public hearings in several regions of the
65 commonwealth to get public information on the topics of the report card. The report card shall be
66 delivered to the governor, speaker of the house of representatives and president of the senate and
67 the members of the health disparities council, established under section 16O of chapter 6A,
68 before July 1 of each year and shall be posted on the official internet site of the office or
69 executive office of health and human services.

70 SECTION 5. Section 5 of chapter 6D, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition, is hereby
71 amended by adding the following sentence:- The commission shall establish goals that are
72 intended to reduce health care disparities in racial, ethnic and disabled communities and in doing
73 so shall seek to incorporate the recommendations of the health disparities council and the office
74 of health equity.
