Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 53 of Chapter 146 of the General Laws, as so appearing in the 2012
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking the last sentence of subsection (a) and replacing
- 3 it with the following:-
- 4 Any operator of such hoisting machinery when it is being used exclusively for
- 5 agricultural purposes or non-commercial use on the private property of the equipment owner
- 6 shall be exempt from this section.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 65A of Chapter 146 of the General Laws, as so appearing in the
- 8 2012 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 14 the figure "1" and replacing
- 9 it with the figure "6"
