In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)

An Act reducing the misuse and abuse of prescription drugs.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 22 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition,
2 is hereby amended by adding the following section:-

3 Section 22. Prescription Drug Drop-off Box Grant Program

4 The department of public safety shall establish a grant program, subject to appropriation,
5 to be known as the prescription drug drop-off box grant program, for the purpose of providing
6 grants to assist police departments with the purchase, placement, operation, or maintenance of
7 prescription drug drop-off boxes at police stations.

8 The department of public safety shall establish guidelines governing the prescription drug
9 drop-off box grant program.
