**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court  
(2015-2016)**  
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An Act relative to elevator inspections for small towns.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Section 64 of Chapter 143 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the  
2 following:

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4           Provided, however, that elevators located on municipal property in a town of 5,000  
5 residents or fewer, shall be inspected and tested at intervals of not less than five years.
