## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act requiring carbon monoxide alarms in schools.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1 Section  $26F\frac{1}{2}$  of Chapter 148 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the

2 following: 3 (g) Every building or structure, including those owned by the Commonwealth, occupied 4 in whole or in part as a school subject to the authority of the Department of Elementary and 5 Secondary Education, that: (1) contains fossil-fuel burning equipment including, but not limited 6 to, a furnace, boiler, water heater, fireplace or any other apparatus, appliance or device that burns 7 fossil fuel; or (2) incorporates enclosed parking within its structure shall be equipped by the 8 Department of Elementary and Secondary Education with working, approved carbon monoxide 9 alarms in conformance with the requirements of the board of fire prevention regulations.
