In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)

An Act relative to certain option B and option C retirees.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary, a member,
2 who retired before July 1, 2004 and is receiving a lesser retirement allowance in accordance with
3 the terms of Options (b) or (c) of subdivision (2) of section 12 of chapter 32 of the General Laws,
4 from a retirement system that accepts the provisions of this act, shall have his retirement
5 allowance, exclusive of any cost of living adjustments, increased by 12 per cent. Any retirement
6 system may accept the provisions of this act by a majority vote of the board of each such system,
7 subject to the approval of the legislative body. For the purposes of this act, “legislative body”
8 shall mean, in the case of a city, the city council in accordance with its charter, in the case of a
9 town, the board of selectmen, in the case of a county, the county retirement board advisory
10 council, in the case of a region, the regional retirement board advisory council, in the case of a
11 district, the district members, and, in the case of an authority, the governing body. For purposes

12 of this act, the state teachers' and state employees' retirement systems shall be deemed to have
13 accepted the provisions of this act.

14 SECTION 2. The provisions of this act shall be prospective from the effective date of
15 this act and shall not entitle any member or spouse of a deceased member to any retroactive
16 benefits.

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
