In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)

An Act relative to non-civil service lay off lists.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, professional firefighters
2 involuntarily separated from service for non-civil service fire departments because of lack of
3 work or lack of money or abolition of his position, his name shall be placed by the administrator
4 on a reemployment list, maintained by the Department of Fire Services, for other non civil
5 service departments.
