Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION XX. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary any historic
2 property, pursuant to the provision of Section 44 of Chapter 85 of the Acts of 1994 shall not be
3 subject to the provisions of Chapter 59 of the General Laws.
