Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION1. Section 2(b) of chapter 6D of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out in line 9, the number "11" and inserting in
- 3 place thereof the number "12".
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 2(b) of chapter 6D of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012
- 5 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out in line 11, the number "3" and inserting in
- 6 place thereof the number "4" and by inserting after the sentence in lines 31 and 32 the following
- 7 new sentence:- "The fourth person appointed by the governor shall be a registered nurse
- 8 licensed to practice in Massachusetts who practices in a patient care setting and shall be initially
- 9 appointed for a term of 5 years."
