The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

Resolve providing for an investigation and study by a special commission relative to vegetation removal by public utility companies.

1 Resolved, That a special commission is hereby established to make an investigation and

2 study relative to the fiscal and environmental impact that vegetation removal by public utility

3 companies has on the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In order to assist lawmakers in determining if the increased safety and reliability resulting from vegetation removal activities are worth the cost, the commission shall investigate and study the effect that vegetation management activities have on endangered species, including whether the endangered species act should apply to such activities, home values, municipal property tax income, water supply quality, public safety, reliability of the electrical grid, and dangers that will exist if trees are not removed. The special commission shall consist of: 2 members of the Senate or their designee, 1 of whom shall be appointed by the minority leader; 2 members of the House

11	of Representatives or their designee, 1 of whom shall be appointed by the minority leader; 2
12	residents on whose property a public utility company completed vegetation removal activities
13	around transmission lines within the preceding 2 years, 1 of whom shall be appointed by the
14	speaker of the House and 1 of whom shall be appointed by the Senate president; 1 member who
15	shall be appointed by the Massachusetts Municipal Association; 2 representatives of public
16	utility companies; 1 town or city assessor, who shall be appointed by the Massachusetts
17	Association of Assessing Officers; the Chair of the Department of Public Utilities or a designee;
18	the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Protection or a designee; the
19	Commissioner of the Department of Fish and Game or a designee; the Secretary of the Executive
20	Office of Public Safety or a designee.
21	All appointments shall be made not later than 30 days after the effective date of this
22	resolve. The chairpersons shall meet with the commission not later than 60 days after the
23	effective date of this resolve.

24	Members shall not receive compensation for their services but may receive
25	reimbursement for the reasonable expenses incurred in carrying out their responsibilities as
26	members of the commission.
27	The commission shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and study
