By Mrs. Orrall of Lakeville, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2926) of Keiko M. Orrall and others for an investigation by a special commission (including members of the General Court) relative to enhancing tourism at the State House. Tourism, Arts and Cultural Development.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)

An Act to Enhance Tourism at the State House.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, there is hereby
2 established a commission to research and assess opportunities to enhance tourism at the State
3 House. The commission shall examine and determine if there are ways to increase retail sales
4 through the State House bookstore and other gift kiosks. The commission shall consist of: the
5 secretary of the commonwealth or a designee, who shall serve as chair; the commissioner of
6 conservation and recreation or a designee; the secretary of housing and economic development
7 or a designee; 2 members of the house of representatives, 1 of whom shall be appointed by the
8 minority leader; 2 members of the senate, 1 of whom shall be appointed by the minority leader;
9 the superintendent of state buildings or a designee, and 3 persons to be appointed by the
10 governor. The commission shall commence within 2 weeks of the effective date of this act and
11 shall meet at least four times. Within 12 months of passage of this bill, the Commission shall
12 present a report on its findings and recommendations.
