Economic Development and Emerging Technologies.

### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to studying gateway cities.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. (a) Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, there shall be a special commission to evaluate and study the impact and supposed benefit of the additional funding and legislative efforts granted to gateway communities. The task force shall consist of

(b) The task force will be held responsible to evaluate the effectiveness of additional funding given to gateway cities through tax exemptions, credits and grants since the creation of

the gateway city program. The group shall report to the legislature how communities currently recognized as gateway cities are utilizing additional funds in a positive way for the community and what current plans are put in place to eventually lower their unemployment rate and increase their median income and education achievable rate. The task force will present a report with recommendations on how to best recover from their current economic state and report it to Clerk of the House and Senate by December 31, 2015.
