In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act increasing access to medical care for veterans.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Section 5 of Chapter 161A of the General Laws is hereby 2 amended by adding at the end
2	thereof the following paragraph:— (s) The authority and any regional or local transportation
3	authority in the Commonwealth shall permit any veteran, as certified by the United States
4	Department of Defense, to use commuter rail, subway, bus, shuttle and boat services at no cost to
5	said veteran; provided that said veteran is utilizing transportation to travel to or from a Veterans
6	Administration hospital for medical care; and provided further, that said veteran presents proof
7	of a medical appointment on the date of travel in the form of a notice from the Veterans
8	Administration indicating the veteran's name and the date and location of said appointment.
