By Mr. Berthiaume of Spencer, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 311) of Donald R. Berthiaume, Jr., and others relative to the authority of parents to exempt their children from a certain standardized exam known as the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) exam. Education.

The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to parental opt-out of PARCC.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, parents or
- 2 guardians of students enrolled in Massachusetts public schools shall be afforded the authority to
- 3 exempt their children from the standardized exam known as the Partnership for Assessment of
- 4 Readiness for College and Career (PARCC). No child so exempted shall be penalized by reason
- 5 of such exemption. The department of education shall promulgate regulations for adjudicatory
- 6 proceedings to resolve any and all disputes arising under this act.
- 7 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
