**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act Relative to the National Guard.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 16 of Chapter 130 of the Acts of 2005, as so appearing, is hereby
2 amended by striking out the first paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following
3 paragraph:-

4 Upon application, as provided in this section, there shall be allowed and paid out of the
5 treasury of the commonwealth without appropriation to each person, who shall have served in
6 the armed forces of the United States in active service as part of Operation Enduring Freedom,
7 Operation Iraqi Freedom, or Operation Noble Eagle who was discharged or released under
8 honorable conditions from such service, the sums specified in this section; if the domicile of
9 every person on account of whose service the application is filed, shall have been in the

- 10 commonwealth for a period of not less than 6 months before the time of his entry into the service
- 11 or if called to active service as a member of the Massachusetts National Guard or an Armed
- 12 Forces Reserve Component of a Massachusetts based unit.
