The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to veteran discrimination.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 4 of chapter 151B of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after subsection 1c the following section:
- 3 D. For an employer, by himself or his agent, because an individual is a veteran to refuse
- 4 to hire or employ or to bar or to discharge from employment such individual or to discriminate
- 5 against such individual in compensation or in terms, conditions or privileges of employment,
- 6 unless based upon a bona fide occupational qualification.
- For the purposes of this subsection, a veteran shall be an individual who served not less
 than 180 days of active service in any branch of the military.
