Joyce (by vote of the town) that the town of Stoughton be authorized to grant six additional licenses for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises. **In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act authorizing the town of Stoughton to grant 6 licenses for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1: Notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, the licensing
2 authority of the Town of Stoughton may grant 6 additional licenses for the sale of all alcoholic
3 beverages to be drunk on the premises pursuant to section 12 of said chapter 138, to
4 establishments located within the town's central business district, as that district is defined by the
5 town's zoning map, as it existed as of May 1, 2014, upon approval of and under conditions set by
6 the licensing authority of the town. The licenses shall be subject to all of said chapter 138 except
7 said section 17.

8 Section 2: The licensing authority shall not approve the transfer of any license issued
9 pursuant to this special act to any location outside of the central business district, but it may grant
10 the license to a new applicant at a location within the central business district; provided, that the

11 applicant files with the licensing authority a letter from the department of revenue indicating that
12 the license is in good standing with the department and that all applicable taxes have been paid.

13 Section 3: If a license granted pursuant to this act is cancelled, revoked or no longer in
14 use, the license shall be returned physically, with all of the legal rights, privileges and restrictions
15 pertaining thereto, to the licensing authority of the town of Stoughton and the licensing authority
16 may then grant the license to a new applicant at a location within the central business district
17 under the same conditions as specified in this act.
