An Act relative to the burial of pets.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Chapter 114 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the following section:-

2           Section 52. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, a town, city,  
3 cemetery corporation or other entity legally responsible for the maintenance or operation of a  
4 cemetery or burial place may designate a portion of such cemetery or burial place for the co-  
5 internment of both human and animal remains. Such co-internment may then be made available  
6 for the remains of the bodies of humans and their pets and may include cremated remains.
