## The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to special education budgets.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Recognizing that school districts and municipalities are unable to

- adequately plan an education budget because of the volatility of special education costs, and in
- 3 an effort to help school districts and municipalities with their growing concern regarding
- 4 extraordinary and unanticipated special education cost, the Commonwealth will devise an
- 5 insurance policy for municipalities in school districts which will allow them to be reimbursed for
- 6 special education costs that exceed 25% of the dollar amount obtained by the formula below:

7 The average special education expenditures for the commonwealth over the last three

- 8 years, divided by the average number of public school students in the commonwealth over the
- 9 last three years, multiplied by the number of students in a particular school district or
- 10 municipality.
