An Act related to unfunded mandates on public schools.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Section 1A of chapter 69 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition,  
2 is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-

3           The commissioner shall conduct an analysis of all new state laws, regulations or  
4 administrative directives, which directly impact the commonwealth’s public schools. The  
5 analysis shall include but not be limited to a reporting of each new action’s cost to school  
6 districts and its employees, impact on time on learning in the classroom and overall impact on  
7 improving student achievement. The commissioner shall file the analyses with the clerks of the  
8 house of representatives and the senate prior to the implementation of related new state laws,  
9 regulations, or administrative directives.
