An Act relative to an affordable housing trust in the town of Duxbury.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Any funds or other assets of the “Affordable Housing Trust Fund”  
2   established by the town of Duxbury pursuant to Chapter 112 of the Acts of 2005 shall be  
3   transferred to that certain affordable housing trust fund established by Duxbury’s annual town  
4   meeting under section 55C of chapter 44 of the General Laws.

6           SECTION 2. Any payments received by the town of Duxbury designated for the  
7   Affordable Housing Trust fund may be applied to that certain affordable housing trust fund  
8   established by Duxbury’s annual town meeting under section 55C of chapter 44 of the General  
9   Laws.

10          SECTION 3. Chapter 112 of the Acts of 2005 is hereby repealed.

11          SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
