By Mrs. Haddad of Somerset, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3573) of Patricia A. Haddad and Michael J. Rodrigues (by vote of the town) that the town of Somerset be authorized to increase the allowable expenditure limit of a fire department emergency medical services revolving fund. **In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act increasing the expenditure limit of the Fire Department Emergency Medical Services Revolving Fund in the town of Somerset.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding section 53E1/2 of chapter 44 of the General Laws or any
2 other general or special law to the contrary, the Fire Chief of the Town of Somerset may expend
3 in any one (1) fiscal year from a Fire Department Emergency Medical Services Revolving Fund
4 under his direct control under said section 53E1/2 an amount up to five per cent (5%) of the
5 amount raised by taxation by the town in the most recent fiscal year for which a tax rate has been
6 certified under section 23 of chapter 59 of the General Laws.

7 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
