An Act relative to the street closure permitting process in the city of Boston.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 17A of chapter 45 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in lines 3 and 4, the words “promulgated  
3 upon written request of its commissioner of parks and recreation”.

4           SECTION 2. Said section 17A of said chapter 45, as so appearing, is hereby further  
5 amended by striking out, in line 4, the words “of such request”.

6           SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
