**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act regarding surveys in public schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby revised as follows, with the addition of Section
2 32B:

3 Section 32B. Student surveys regarding personal or private issues; Requirements for
4 parental notification and consent.

5 No student in any public elementary or secondary school, without the prior written
6 consent of the parent or guardian, shall be requested or required to submit to a survey, analysis,
7 or evaluation concerning personal issues including, but not limited to: (1)emotional and
8 psychological concerns or issues, whether concerning the student or his family (including mental
9 health screenings); (2) sexual behavior and attitudes; (3)illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating, or
10 demeaning behaviors; (4) feelings of victimization; (5) suicide attempts or ideation, or self-
11 abuse; (6) birth control or abortion; (7) critical appraisals of other individuals with whom
12 respondent has family relationships; (8) legally recognized privileged or analogous relationships,

13 such as those with lawyers, physicians, therapists, and ministers; (9) political affiliations; or
14 (10) income. This will apply to all such surveys whether from a state or federal agency, whether
15 administered in a classroom setting, by a school counselor, a school nurse, or school based health
16 center staff member. All such screenings, surveys, analyses, and evaluations shall be shall be
17 made reasonably available with adequate advance notice to parents, guardians, educators, school
18 administrators, and others for inspection and review prior to being administered.
