An Act relative to increasing fines for safety belt violations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 13A of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the
- 2 2012 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking the second paragraph in line 25 and
- 3 inserting in place thereof the following:-

Any person who operates a motor vehicle without a safety belt, and any person

5 16 years of age or over who rides as a passenger in a motor vehicle without wearing a safety belt

in violation of this section, shall be subject, for a first offense, to a written warning. Any person

who operates a motor vehicle without a safety belt in violation of this section shall be subject, for

a second or subsequent offense, to a fine of 25 dollars. Any person 16 years of age or over who

rides as a passenger in a motor vehicle without wearing a safety belt in violation of this section

shall be subject, for a second or subsequent offense, to a fine of 10 dollars. Any operator of a

motor vehicle shall be subject to an additional fine of 10 dollars for each person under the age of

12 16 and no younger than 12 who is a passenger in said motor vehicle and not wearing a safety

belt. The provisions of this section shall be enforced by law enforcement agencies when an

operator of a motor vehicle or passenger who rides in the motor vehicle is not wearing a safety

- belt in violation of motor vehicle laws. Safety belt violations will not result in surcharges on
- motor vehicle insurance premiums and a police officer may not search or inspect a motor
- vehicle, its contents, the driver, or a passenger solely because of a violation of this section.
