**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act relative to the curatorship program.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 44 of chapter 85 of the acts of 1994 is hereby amended by inserting at the end
2 thereof the following sentence:

3 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, any historic property
4 designated as such by this section shall not be subject to the provisions of chapter 59 of the
5 General Laws.
