The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act to establish the state seal of biliteracy.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For purposes of this article, ‘foreign language’ means a language other than
2 English, and includes American Sign Language.

3 SECTION 2. Chapter 69 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition,
4 is hereby amended by adding after Section 10 a new section:-

5 Section 1P. The board shall establish the State Seal of Biliteracy to recognize high school
6 graduates who have attained a high level

7 of proficiency in speaking, reading, writing and listening in one or more languages in
8 addition to English.

9 The purposes of the State Seal of Biliteracy are as follows: (1) To encourage students to
10 study languages; (2) To certify attainment of biliteracy; (3) To provide employers with a method
11 of identifying people with language and biliteracy skills; (4) To provide universities with a

12 method to recognize and give academic credit to applicants seeking admission; (5) To prepare
13 pupils with 21st century skills; (6) To recognize and promote foreign language instruction and
14 native and heritage language instruction in public schools; (7) To strengthen intergroup
15 relationships, affirm the value in diversity, and honor the multiple cultures and languages of the
16 Commonwealth.

17 The Secretary of Education shall be responsible for administering the State Seal of
18 Biliteracy program including preparing and delivering to participating school districts an
19 appropriate insignia to be affixed to the diploma or transcript of the student indicating that the
20 student has been awarded a State Seal of Biliteracy. The Department of Elementary and
21 Secondary Education, in consultation with the Massachusetts Foreign Language Association, and
22 in alignment with national trends for existing state Seals in the nation, shall promulgate
23 regulations governing criteria for the awarding of the State Seal of Biliteracy.

24 A school district that participates in the program under this section shall: maintain
25 appropriate records in order to identify pupils who have earned a State Seal of Biliteracy and
26 affix the appropriate insignia to the diploma or transcript of each pupil who earns a State Seal of
27 Biliteracy. State Seals of Biliteracy shall also be available electronically.
