To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives,

Message from His Excellency the Governor recommending legislation relative to validating the actions taken at the annual town election held in the town of Blandford.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act validating the actions taken at the annual town election held in the town of Blandford.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding section 10 of chapter 39 of the General Laws or any
- 2 general or special law or town by-law to the contrary, all acts, proceedings and votes taken by
- 3 the town of Blandford at its annual town election on May 7, 2016, and all actions taken pursuant
- 4 thereto and in reliance thereon, are hereby ratified, validated and confirmed to the same extent as
- 5 if the annual town election had been held on the date required by the town by-laws for such
- 6 election and the warrant therefor had been signed and posted in accordance with law.
- 7 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
