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**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act authorizing the town of Webster to grant a license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding section 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, the local
2 licensing authority of the town of Webster may grant one additional license for the sale of all
3 alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises under section 12 of said chapter 138 to Bridan
4 Enterprises LLC d/b/a Cappellinis, located at 141 Worcester Road in said town of Webster. The
5 license shall be subject to all of said chapter 138 except said section 17.

6 The licensing authority shall not approve the transfer of the license to any other person,
7 organization, or location, but it may grant the license to a new applicant at the same location if
8 the applicant files a letter from the department of revenue and a letter from the department of
9 unemployment assistance indicating that the license is in good standing with the departments and
10 that all applicable taxes, fees, and contributions have been paid. Upon the issuance of the license
11 under this section, Bridan Enterprises LLC d/b/a Cappellinis shall return to the licensing
12 authority the license it currently holds for the sale of wines and malt beverages to be drunk on
13 the premises.

14 If the license granted under this section is cancelled, revoked or no longer in use at the
15 location of original issuance, it shall be returned physically, with all of the legal rights, privileges
16 and restrictions pertaining thereto, to the licensing authority which may then grant the license to
17 a new applicant at the same location under the same conditions as specified in this act.

18 SECTION 2. This act shall take place upon its passage.
