Ashe for the adoption of resolutions memorializing the President of the United States and Congress to require consumer reporting agencies to meet the standards of the Fair Credit Reporting Act; and the petition (accompanied by resolutions, House, No. 3318) of Peter J. Durant and others for the adoption of resolutions memorializing the Congress of the United States to convene a Constitutional Convention; reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 4616) ought to be adopted.
