An Act relative to teacher certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 71 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition, is hereby  
2 amended by inserting after Section 54B the following section:-

3 Section 54C. All elementary and secondary school teachers in the Commonwealth of  
4 Massachusetts shall be required to be certified in the administration of cardiopulmonary  
5 resuscitation, as evidenced by the successful completion of a training course in cardiopulmonary  
6 resuscitation from the American Red Cross, American Heart Association or other agency  
7 approved by the Department of Public Health.
