**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act relative to special education reimbursements.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Subsection (c) of section 5A of chapter 71B of the General Laws, as
2 appearing in the 2010 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the fourth sentence and
3 inserting in place thereof the following:-

4 The costs of programs shall be reimbursed 100 per cent of all the approved costs that
5 exceed 4 times the state average per pupil foundation budget, as defined in said chapter 70, for
6 the previous fiscal year.
