An Act relative to LGBT awareness training for aging services providers.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 19A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 official edition,  
2 is hereby amended by inserting after section 6 the following section:-

3           Section 6A. The department shall focus on the prevention and elimination of  
4 discrimination based on sexual orientation and gender identity and expression, as well as on  
5 improving access to services for lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender elders and caregivers. To  
6 that end, the department shall work to ensure that a curriculum is developed that will support the  
7 training for the delivery of services. The department shall require that over a period of time such  
8 training be completed by all providers of services who contract with or receive funding from the

9 department, from Aging Service Access Points and/or from the MassHealth Office of Long Term  
10 Care, or whose services are certified by the department.

11 The department shall develop a process and timeframe for completing such trainings by  
12 those who deliver services.
