The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to campaign contribution limits for certain candidates running for office in a state election.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 7A of chapter 55 of the General Laws as appearing in the 2012 2 Official Edition is hereby amended by striking clause (a)(1) in lines 1-5 and inserting the 3 following its place:- An individual may make campaign contributions to candidates or 4 candidate's committees. The aggregate of all such contributions for the benefit of any one 5 candidate and that candidate's committee shall not exceed the sum of \$1,000 dollars in any 6 calendar year, provided, however, that the aggregate of contributions by an individual to a 7 candidate seeking election to the office of state senator or state representative in a state election 8 who previously, in the same calendar year, sought election to the office of state senator or state 9 representative in a special election, shall not exceed the sum of \$1,000 in the period beginning on 10 the first day of January and ending on the day of the special election, and an additional \$1,000 11 during the period that begins on the day after the special election and ends on the last day of 12 December following the special election.
