An Act providing for notice to the public of hazardous waste sites.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 19 of Chapter 21A shall be amended by inserting the following:

2 (c) A licensed hazardous waste site cleanup professional shall provide written notification  
3 to the City or Town Clerk in the municipality where the site is located, by certified mail, within 7  
4 days of the notification of the agency, federal or state requires posting of the known  
5 contamination at the location. The Town or city clerk is required to maintain a database of all  
6 locations of which they have received notification of contamination by property address and  
7 make the database available to the public.

8 Failure to comply with this section shall result in a fine of \$1000 for the first offense,  
9 \$2500 for any further offenses and up to 2 ½ years confinement in the house of correction or  
10 both.
