An Act concerning the trapping of fur-bearing mammals.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 131, Section 11 is hereby amended by adding after the words, “The  
2   director shall also provide trapper training courses to certify licensed trappers on the effective  
3   use of box, cage and conibear type traps, for furbearing mammals, including beaver or muskrat”  
4   the following: -

5                   Any person licensed to trap fur-bearing mammals shall follow the “Best  
6   Management Practices” guidelines approved by the Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies,  
7   and said license shall allow for the possession of equipment recommended under those  
8   guidelines.
