An Act relative to insurance surcharges.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 113B of chapter 175 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting, in line 216, after the word “incident” the
3 following sentence:-

4 Driving a motor vehicle which has an expired inspection sticker shall not be considered a
5 surchargeable incident.
