**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act to further reduce EBT fraud.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 2 of chapter 18 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 Official
2 Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in subsection (k), the words “provided further, that
3 the department shall not require the use of photo identification for individuals who are 60 years
4 of age or over, blind, disabled or victims of domestic violence;”
