An Act relative to jewelry sold by hawkers and peddlers.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Section 16 of Chapter 101 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 Official Edition,  
2 is hereby amended by striking out, in line 1, the word “jewelry”, and further in lines 2 to 4, the  
3 words “This prohibition shall not apply to costume jewelry, so called, with a dollar value of not  
4 more than ten dollars per piece made by a nonprofit or charitable organization”.
