**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act relative to the transfer of retirees to a Medicare health plan.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Subsection (a) of section 18A of chapter 32B of the General Laws as
2 appearing in the most recent edition is hereby amended by striking the words “a Medicare health
3 plan” and inserting the following:- “Medicare Part A, Part B, or a Medicare supplement health
4 plan”

5 SECTION 2. Subsection (a) of said section 18A of said chapter 32B of the General Laws
6 as appearing in the most recent edition is hereby amended in line 9 by inserting after the words
7 “Medicare Part A” the following:- “,including but not limited to Part B,”

8 SECTION 3. Subsection (c) of said section 18A of chapter 32B of the General Laws as
9 appearing in the most recent edition is hereby amended by inserting after the word “transfer” the

10 following:- “including but not limited in the event that as provided in subsection (a), the retiree
11 or spouse is no longer required to continue family coverage for a dependent in a plan other than a
12 Medicare health plan offered by a governmental unit.”
