Resolve relative to an automatic reduction in the sales tax.

1 **Resolved**, The executive office for administration and finance and the office of the state
2 treasurer, in consultation with the department of revenue and the senate and house committees on
3 ways and means, shall study the feasibility of establishing a schedule for an automatic reduction
4 in the sales tax to 5 per cent if certain thresholds in revenue growth are exceeded. The executive
5 office for administration and finance and the office of the state treasurer shall submit a final
6 report of its findings and recommendations, together with drafts of legislation necessary to
7 implement those recommendations, by filing the same with the clerks of the senate and house not
8 later than December 31, 2015.
