**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act to reduce lottery littering.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The Massachusetts State Treasurers Office shall instruct the Massachusetts
2 State Lottery to develop a second chance game involving all lottery tickets and scratch tickets
3 that are not winners. The purpose of the game is to increase the amount of scratch tickets and
4 lottery tickets recycled and reduce the amount of scratch tickets and lottery tickets thrown away
5 or littered.

6 SECTION 2. The second chance game must be operational no later than 180 days of the
7 passage of this bill.
