An Act An act to promote private sector job growth and reduce state spending.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 53 of chapter 7 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended, in line 18, by striking the figure “\$500,000”, and inserting  
3 in place thereof the following figure:- “\$3,000,000”.

4           SECTION 2. Section 54 of said chapter 7, as so appearing, is hereby amended by striking  
5 the first sentence of clause (4), in lines 54-56, inclusive, and inserting in place thereof the  
6 following:-

7           (4) The agency shall prepare a comprehensive realistic written estimate of the costs of  
8 regular agency employees’ providing the subject services.
