**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act to promote and advance motorcycle safety.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 34 of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition,
2 is hereby amended by inserting after the word “safety”, in line 7, the following words:- ;
3 provided, however, that the registrar shall provide rebates of not less than \$100 to persons under
4 the age of 21 who successfully complete a motorcycle basic rider course approved by the
5 registrar pursuant to section 8 and that the total of such rebates shall not exceed 20 per cent of
6 the funds so deposited.
