#### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act to prohibit the use of mobile telephones while operating a motor vehicle.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Section 13B of Chapter 90 of the General Laws is amended by striking the section in its entirety and inserting the following new language:-
- 3 Section 13B. (a) No operator of a motor vehicle shall use a mobile electronic device or a
- 4 mobile telephone, unless said telephone is a hands-free mobile telephone. No operator of a motor
- 5 vehicle shall use a mobile telephone, mobile electronic device or other device capable of
- 6 accessing the internet to compose, send or read an electronic message while operating such
- 7 vehicle; provided, however, that this section shall not apply to the operator of a public safety
- 8 vehicle utilizing a mobile telephone, hands-free mobile telephone or other mobile electronic
- 9 device in the performance of his official duties. For the purposes of this section, an operator shall

not be considered to be operating a motor vehicle if the vehicle is stationary and not located in a part of the roadway intended for travel.

- (b) Whoever violates this section shall be punished by a fine of \$100 for a first offense, by a fine of \$250 for a second offense and by a fine of \$500 for a third or subsequent offense. A violation of this section may be considered a moving violation for purposes of the safe driver insurance plan under section 113B of chapter 175.
- (c) It shall be an affirmative defense for an operator to produce documentary or other evidence that the use of a mobile telephone or other mobile electronic device that is the basis of the alleged violation was made for emergency purposes including, but not limited to, an emergency call to a law enforcement agency, health care provider, fire department or other emergency services agency or entity.
