### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to workers compensation for veterans.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Subsection 7A of Section 1 of Chapter 152 of the General Laws, is hereby amended by
- 2 inserting at the end of the paragraph the following:-
- 3 "Any employee who served in the United States Armed Forces or National Guard and as
- 4 a result of such service sustained an emotional or physical injury, who in the course of, or arising
- 5 out of, this employment, receives a personal injury which combines with, or is aggravated or
- 6 prolonged by, such disability, shall be entitled to compensation regardless of the extent to which
- 7 the services related disability contributes."
