An Act establishing a sick leave bank for John J. Monahan, an employee of the Trial Court.

*Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to establish forthwith a sick leave bank for a certain employee of the trial court, therefore, it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the trial court shall establish a  
2   sick leave bank for John J. Monahan, an employee of the trial court. Any employee of the trial  
3   court may voluntarily contribute 1 or more sick, personal or vacation days to the sick leave bank  
4   for use by John J. Monahan. If John J. Monahan terminates employment with the department or  
5   requests to dissolve the sick leave bank, any remaining time in the sick leave bank shall be  
6   transferred to the trial court paid leave bank. Sick leave bank days shall not be used for absences  
7   unrelated to the illness or disability that necessitated the establishment of the sick leave bank as  
8   determined by the trial court.
