An Act relative to the composition of the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 1E of chapter 15 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014  
2   Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the second sentence, and inserting in place  
3   thereof the following:- The 9 members appointed by the governor shall consist of 1  
4   representative of a labor organization selected by the governor from a list of 3 nominees  
5   provided by the Massachusetts State Labor Council, AFL-CIO; 1 representative of business or  
6   industry selected by the governor with a demonstrated commitment to education; 1  
7   representative of parents of school children selected by the governor from a list of 3 nominees  
8   provided by the Massachusetts Parent Teachers Association; and 6 additional members, one of  
9   whom shall be a retired teacher.
