The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to municipal contracts in the city of Somerville.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 46A of chapter 240 of the acts of 1899, as most recently amended
- 2 by chapter 201 of the acts of 1993, is hereby further amended by striking out the first sentence
- 3 and inserting in place thereof the following 3 sentences:- All contracts made by any department,
- 4 board or commission shall comply with section 17 of chapter 30B of the General Laws. A
- 5 contract required to be in writing shall not be deemed executed until signed by the mayor and the
- 6 head of the department, board or commission making the contract. When contracts are required
- 7 to be in writing under said section 17 of said chapter 30B, contracts for supplies, services and
- 8 construction may be subject to additional signature requirements under applicable city
- 9 ordinances.
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
