## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act to involve youth in civic engagement.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1	SECTION 1. The department of elementary and secondary education, in collaboration
2	with the youth advisory committee established in section 2, shall develop not less than 1 civic
3	education model curriculum unit to align with the history and social science curriculum
4	framework and shall include, but not be limited to, the following topics: (i) the function and
5	composition of the branches of local, state and federal government; (ii) the history of social
6	movements; (iii) current events; and (iv) community-based action and service learning projects.
7	The model curriculum shall include an experiential or practical unit, which may include a
8	weekend program, a model United Nations or other program promoting civic engagement and
9	may conclude with a voter registration drive. The experiential or practical unit may be offered as
10	an extra-curricular or out of school activity. The model curriculum units shall be developed not
11	later than July 1, 2017. The department shall develop an evaluation process to assess the
12	curriculum, pedagogy and teaching materials during the piloting of a course, unit or program
13	established through a civic education model curriculum unit.

14	SECTION 2. There shall be a youth advisory committee consisting of: 2 members of the
15	governor's youth council; 2 members of the student advisory council established in section 1E of
16	chapter 15; and 2 members of Teens Leading The Way. The department of elementary and
17	secondary education shall consult with the youth advisory committee on the development,
18	review, enhancement and evaluation of the civic education model curriculum units. The
19	involvement of the youth advisory committee by the department shall coincide with the
20	department's timeline for developing civic education model curriculum units.
21	SECTION 3. A school implementing a model civic education curriculum unit shall be
22	considered to have fulfilled its obligation relative to civics education pursuant to section 2 of

chapter 71 of the General Laws.
